# **Year 6 – Collage: Classification**



Rationale: In this unit of work, the children will study the work of Eileen Downes – an American artist who describes herself as 'the artist who paints with torn bits of paper instead of paint for a palette.' Pupils will choose an animal and study its form, texture and colour before reproducing its likeness using paper collage.

## **Key Learning:**

#### Substantive Knowledge:

- Question and make thoughtful observations about starting points and select ideas to use in their work.
- Explore the roles and purposes of artists, craftspeople and designers working in different times and cultures.
- Compare ideas, methods and approaches in their own and others' work and say what they think and feel about them.
- Adapt their work according to their views and describe how they might develop it further.
- Annotate work in a journal.

#### Disciplinary Knowledge:

- Work from a variety of sources including observation, photographs and digital images.
- Work in a sustained and independent way to create a detailed drawing.
- Use a sketchbook to collect and develop ideas.

### Collage:

- Add collage to a painted, printed or drawn background
- Use collage as a means of extending work from initial ideas.

#### **Building on Prior Knowledge**

Key Stage 1:

**Year 4**: Collage – Experiment with a range of collage techniques such as tearing, overlapping and layering.

#### **Preparing for Future Learning**

**KS3:** to use a range of techniques to record their observations in sketchbooks, journals and other media as a basis for exploring their ideas & to use a range of techniques and media, including painting & to increase their proficiency in the handling of different materials & to analyse and evaluate their own work, and that of others, in order to strengthen the visual impact or applications of their work & about the history of art, craft, design and architecture, including periods, styles and major movements from ancient times up to the present day.

#### Overview:

Lesson 1 Immerse in art or artist Look at the work of ED based on animals and butterflies

Lesson 2: **Identify and exemplify skills and techniques** pupils identify how the artist creates texture, shape, tone using collage.

Lesson 3: **Teach the skills** model how add collage to a black and white photo of an animal

Lesson 4: **Practice the skills** sketch out part of an animal from a photo and practise adding collage.

Lesson 5: **Apply the skills to final piece** pupils sketch out their chosen animal and use collage to add colour and detail.

Lesson 6: **Evaluate the project** compare ideas, methods and approaches in their own work, say what they think and feel about it with greater insight.

# Key Vocabulary

**Collage**: An art technique where different materials (paper, fabric, photos, etc.) are glued onto a surface to create a composition.

**Mixed Media**: Combining various materials and techniques (e.g. paint, paper, fabric) in one artwork.

**Layering**: Placing materials on top of each other to build texture or depth.

**Overlapping**: Arranging materials so they partially cover each other, creating visual interest.

**Composition**: The way elements are arranged in an artwork to create balance and focus.

**Texture**: The feel or appearance of a surface—can be real (tactile) or implied (visual).

**Background**: The part of the artwork behind the main subject; often sets the scene or mood.
