Year 4 – Painting: L.S Lowry



Rationale: In this scheme, children will create their own paintings inspired by the famous artist L.S. Lowry. They will explore how he captured life in industrial cities using simple shapes and bright colours. Let's think about the details in our surroundings and express their unique perspectives through their artwork!

Key Learning:

- Brush techniques are explored to create different effects.
- To mix and match colours to objects in the natural or man-made forms.
- Use black and white to lighten and darken tones.
- To combine colours and create tints, tone and shades to reflect the purpose of the work.
- To mix and blend colours using a soft and smooth gradient. Colours are blended with little visual appearance of intervals.
- Use water colours paint to produce washes for backgrounds then add detail.

Assessment/Key Skills
