# <u>Year 5 – What creates a rainforest and why are they found where</u> they are?



Rationale: Rationale: The children will take a closer look at the mysteries of tropical rainforests. From the layers of the forest and its animal inhabitants, to the unique climate found in the tropics. They will compare a British forest with the Amazon rainforest, and begin to explore some of the conservation issues surrounding the destruction of rainforest habitats.

#### **Key Vocabulary**

**Ecosystem** - all of the living and non-living things in an area **Habitat** - the place where a living thing makes its home **Camouflage** - animals hide themselves by blending into its surroundings

**Climate** - weather and temperature usually found in a particular area

 ${\bf carbon\ dioxide}$  - gas released when fuel is burned and when animals and humans breathe / plants use up carbon dioxide

**oxygen** - gas released by plants / breathed in by animals and humans

monsoon - wind that changes direction with the seasonstemperate - a climate with warm summers and cool summershumid - having a high level of moisture in the air

equatorial - warm rainforests growing near the equator
tropical - tropics are warm all year around and rainforests can grow
