## **Year 5 – Districts in Paris**

## Spring 1 – My town and telling the time



**NIVEAU ROUGE - MODULE 3** 

**Rationale**: This unit teaches Year 5 to understand a range of clock times by listening or reading, They will learn to pronounce the names of some world cities and use adjectives and feminine nouns in spoken sentences.

#### **Learning Objectives:**

- be introduced to five more places found in a town (feminine nouns)
- revise the concept of the grammatical gender of nouns
- discover what an arrondissement is
- learn to tell the time on quarter past the hour
- practise understanding a range of clock times by listening or reading
- learn about La Poste (the postal service) and la SNCF (national railways)
- learn how to pronounce the names of some world cities: Moscou, New York, Sydney, Tokyo
- learn that the time in Moscow is 2 hours ahead of Paris
- revise the agreement of an adjective with a feminine noun
- practise using compound sentences with a coordinating conjunction
- practise listening, speaking and writing clock times
- practise using adjectives with feminine nouns in spoken sentences
- learn about some mainline railway stations in Paris
- create some written compound sentences
- learn about ordinal numbers
- learn about the 1er arrondissement

#### **Overview:**

Lesson 1: To understand what an arrondissement is.

Lesson 2: To tell a range of clock times.

Lesson 3: To use compound sentences with a coordinating iunction.

Lesson 4: To learn about some mainline railway stations in Paris.

Lesson 5: To learn about ordinal numbers.

### Impact/Assessment

Most Children will: • know that *un arrondissement* is an administrative district in Paris. • know that *La Poste* is the name of the public postal service company in France, similar to Royal Mail in the UK; *une poste/la poste* is also the name of the post office in the local community. • know that the main colour of the French postal service is yellow, symbolising speed and light.

• know that the *Gare du Nord*, Paris, is the station for trains between France and the United Kingdom • join in singing an action song such as *Meunier*, *tu dors*. • create a compound sentence with a coordinating conjunction

Less Able Children will: • can ask questions that include the conjunction. • know that an ordinal number tells the position of something in a list, such as 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5<sup>th</sup> • listen to a story such as *Dix pour une galette*. • find out what facilities there are in a town

More Able Children will: • an 'e' is added to the end of an adjective, to make it agree with a feminine noun, the preceding letter will now be sounded out, if it was a previously silent (final) consonant, e.g. petite, grande. • recite a rhyme such as Trois crêpes. .
