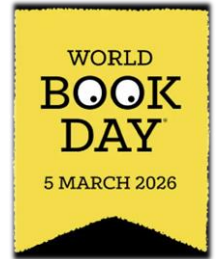
At Lowerhouse Junior School, we build everything we do around our four key values of
