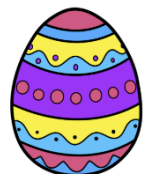
International Women's Day – Yr4/5 Girls' Football

Digital Leaders Shine with Weekly Online Safety Blogs!

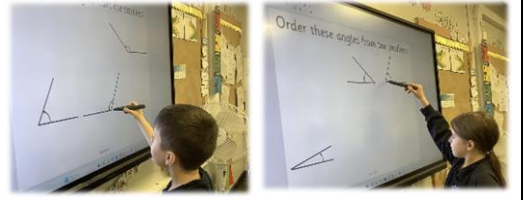

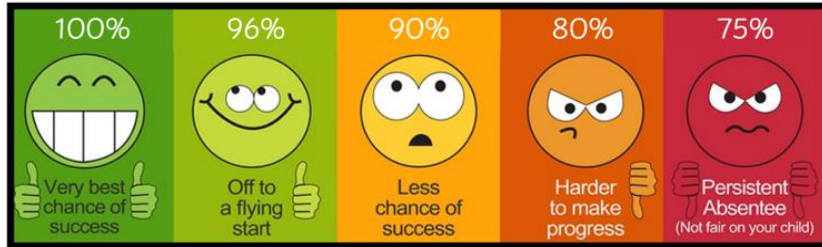


Curriculum In Action: Maths – Ordering Angles (Y4 Maple)
