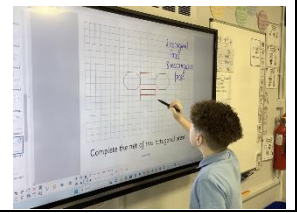
### Week of Sport Continues (Cross-Country & High 5 Netball)

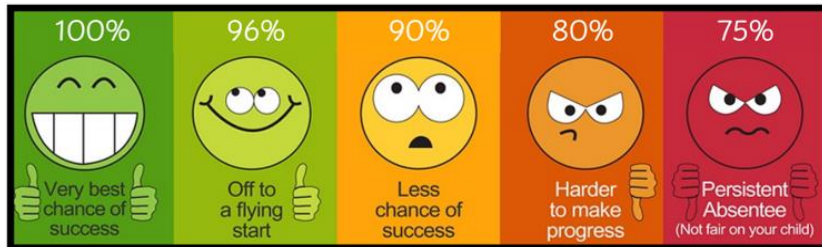


## Curriculum In Action: Maths – Creating Nets of 3D Shapes (Y6 Ash)
