Tuesday 9th June 2026

- Children will need to arrive at school for 6.30am the morning of the visit. Children must be dropped off by a parent.

- There will be one enroute stop based around drivers permitted driving times. This was Warwick Services last year – we are aiming for the same this year.

Meals

- Children will require a packed lunch for the first day of the visit.
- Evening meal provided from Pizza Express ordered by the children
- Breakfast provided from Wembley International Hotel (Full English or cereal/toast/pastries)
- Lunch Day 2 is a packed lunch provided from Wembley International Hotel ordered by the children
- School will provide a meal for the children on the return journey. This was McDonalds last year and we will aim for this again.

Snacks

- Please provide your children with a range of snacks for the visit. There will be no access to a fridge so these must be able to last.
- School will provide a range of snacks and drinks on the coach in between visits.
- Children are permitted to bring a small amount of sweets however please make this sensible. Please can this be something that will last and not melt.

Required Items

- One change of clothes – appropriate clothing must be worn for entry to Tower of London and the theatre
- Small toiletries
- Towel if your child will wish to shower
- Rucksack for clothing and snacks. Children must be able to carry this with them at times when required.
- Water bottle
- Weather appropriate items e.g. coat/hat/suncream
- School will provide a high-viz for each child which must be worn at all times
- Suitable footwear for walking

Spending Money


- All spending money is the responsibility of the children.
- School cannot take responsibility for pupil's individual spends
- Amount of spending money is at parents discretion
- Please consider the use of Go Henry/Monzo cards or similar as cash was not accepted at a lot of the shops on Southbank

Medications


If your child requires medication (including travel sickness/heyfever tablets) to be administered at any point on the visit, please take a medical form home with you today to be handed in with your child's medication on the day of the trip.

This will be kept secure by a member of staff and administered as required.

Safeguarding

- There are strictly no phones permitted for the duration of the visit. This is in line with our school safeguarding policies.
 - School staff have all contact information needed and parents will be provided with regular updates via text from school.
 - Class dojo will be updated with photos throughout the visit and text messages will be sent as updates.
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Safeguarding

- Two designated safeguarding leads are in attendance on the visit.
 - A base contact is in place with 24 hour contact.
 - All staff and volunteers have full DBS clearance as per school's safeguarding policy
 - Entry to most of the attractions has strict bag checks and security
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Risk Assessment

School has completed a thorough risk assessment for the visit which has been sent to and approved by the Local Authority.

Where staff may feel that the children are at any risk of harm, they will be removed from the activity/location immediately where they will embark the coach.

Children are allocated a group leader who will be their 'go to' adult for the duration of the visit.



Risk Assessment

- Children will all carry a lanyard and laminated card which holds school mobile numbers for Mrs Marsden and Mrs Carter . This card can be handed to a member of staff at any visit location to contact us if required.
- Children will wear Lowerhouse Junior School high-viz vests at all times.
- Children will be transported via a private coach for the duration of the visit. They will not be walking any long distances with members of the public or using public transport.

Travel

Children will be transported by Ava Coach and have an allocated driver for the duration of the visit.

One en-route stop will take place on each journey where children can use the toilet.

A toilet is present on the coach for emergencies.
